The <u>Sandy Bill of Rights</u> was passed unanimously in the New Jersey Senate and Assembly with widespread, bipartisan support but was <u>conditionally vetoed</u> by Governor Chris Christie. Despite voting in favor of the bill, some legislators are now <u>flip-flopping</u> their position. **Sandy survivors deserve better**!

Here's just some of the rights Sandy survivors would have under the "Bill of Rights":

- The right to a plain language explanation of the application process for any recovery funds;
- The right to know why an application is rejected and to appeal that rejection with a specified timeframe;
- The right to know current status of an application and position on any wait list;
- The right to have funds distributed fairly.
